There is a used radio transmitter for sale near Dublin. It's the same type of transmitter we use in Central Asia and Eswatini. It could be useful for a future TWR radio project, so I was sent to the transmitter site last month to have a look. I sent a report about the transmitter to our TWR management, so now they're deciding how to proceed.

I've recently returned from West Central Asia where we are replacing a very old transmitter with a newer one. After well over a year of planning, it's encouraging to see this project beginning to take shape. A 28-ton consignment of transformers, cables, cooling equipment and material for a raised floor recently arrived at the transmitter site.

While some of our group installed the raised floor for the transmitter, I moved an equipment rack into the new transmitter hall. The equipment rack controls which countries (Iran, Russia & Ukraine) the antenna broadcasts to. The equipment rack is needed for each evening's broadcasts on the old transmitter, so it had to be operational at the end of each day. The picture shows the equipment rack on the new floor. The new transmitter will fit over the holes on the right. Please pray that the new transmitter arrives in Central Asia safely.
